


A National Framework for Climate Services for the UK: So Far



Motivation:

There is plenty of excellent Climate Services work in the UK **but** a **'driving force'** promoting continuity & longevity is **missing**, leading to lack of coordination for the UK's rich climate services landscape.

Action:

Over an 18-month project, 80+ individuals from 60+ organisations across the UK have provided recommendations for a National Framework for Climate Services for the UK.

A National Framework for Climate Services for the UK: So Far



Findings:

There is a clear desire and need in the community for high level coordination & centralised leadership / focal point to enhance the pull through of climate information into adaptation & resilience.

This will ensure that the legacy of past, current & future investment into climate services is **increased resilience** through **improved adaptation**.





The NFCS should be a **multiplier**: **adding value** to existing programs and initiatives & **enhancing outputs**.



This recommended structure for the UK NFCS will allow the UK to build upon its strong foundations

Some key findings from the Central Hub workshop:



0-2 years:

- Develop value proposition.
- Capitalise on opportunities offered by NAP3 and new gov. structures.
- Funding!

Whoever facilitates
this going forward
should not be
leading as such, but
enabling others to
deliver

The focus should be on what's 'good enough' – need to bring along everyone, no matter where they are in their journey

2 - 5 years:

- Professionalisation of Climate Service providers (e.g. chartership).
- CCRA4, EU Standards work: opportunities

5 - 10 years:

- Expansion / diversification of funding.
- Reflection point: what is working, what isn't?

The climate services standard could be used as a guide to ensure best practice
